What Is The Old Testament/ Covenant?

Hebrews 9:18

Therefore not even the **first** covenant was dedicated without blood

Exodus 24:8

This is the blood of the covenant which the LORD has made with you according to all these words

Names Of The Covenant

- The Testimony (Exodus 25:21; 31:18)
- The Old Covenant (2Corinthians 3:14)
- The First Covenant (Hebrews 8:7; 9:1, 15, 18)
- The Law (Matthew 5:17)
- The Law of Moses (Luke 2:22)

Who are the constituents of the Old Covenant/ Testament?

Acts 14:15-16

Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men with the same nature as you, and preach to you that you should turn from these useless things to the living God...who in bygone generations allowed all nations to walk in their own ways

Psalm 147:19-20

God declares His Word to Jacob, His statues and judgments to Israel. God has **not** dealt thus with any nation; and as for His judgments, they have not known them

Ephesians 2:12

Without Christ, being aliens from the common wealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world

Nehemiah 9:14

You made known to them (Israel) Your holy Sabbath, and commanded them precepts, statutes and laws, by the hand of Moses your servant

Is It An Extension Of The Abrahamic Covenant?

Galatians 3:15

Brethren, I speak in terms of human relations: even though it is only a man's covenant, yet when it has been ratified, no one sets it aside or adds conditions to it

What was the Purpose of the Old Covenant?

Exodus 34:28

God wrote on the tablets the words of the Covenant, the Ten Commandments

Deuteronomy 4:13

So God declared to you His Covenant which He commanded you to perform, the Ten Commandments; and He wrote them on two tablets

What was God's purpose for The Law?

Galatians 3:19

What purpose then does the law serve? It was added because of transgressions

Galatians 3:24

The law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith

The Purpose Of The Law

- Because of transgressions (Galatians 3:19)
- To stop people from justifying their sin (Romans 3:19)
- To bring the full knowledge of sin (Romans 3:20)

The Purpose Of The Law

- That the offense of sin might abound (Romans 5:20)
- To make sin exceedingly sinful (Romans 7:12-13)
- To lead the sinner to Christ for justification by faith alone (Galatians 3:24)

When Did The Old Covenant Expire?

Jeremiah 31:31-32

Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah—

Jeremiah 31:31-32

Not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, My covenant which they broke...says the Lord

Matthew 5:17

Do not think that I came to destroy the Law of the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to **fulfill**

Hebrews 8:13

In that He says, "A NEW COVENANT," He has made the FIRST OBSOLETE. Now what is becoming OBSOLETE and growing old is ready to vanish away

Galatians 5:19

What purpose then does the law serve? It was added because of transgression, **TILL** the Seed should come to whom the promise was made

Ephesians 2:15

Christ abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances

Matthew 26:27-28

Drink, all of you. For this is My blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins

What Good Is The Old Testament Now?

Galatians 3:24-25

The law was out tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor

Romans 6-7

- The believer is not under the law (Romans 6:14)
- The law has no dominion over the believer (Romans 7:1-7)
- The believer has died to the law (Romans 7:4)

According To The Holy Spirit

- The law has no jurisdiction over the believer
- Our relationship to the law is terminated
